Maximum Funding Per Project:

The maximum funding available per project is: €300,000 from DAFM and €100,000 from Teagasc. Therefore, the total combined DAFM/Teagasc public funding to eligible Irish Research Performing Organisations (RPOs) shall not be greater than €400,000 per **project**. It is not mandatory for Irish applicants to request grant-aid from both DAFM and Teagasc, however where only one of these funders is selected, this must be stated clearly in the Budget Comments section of the pre-registration and full proposal application forms and the maximum grant available will be that stated above per project for each funder respectively. The selected national institutions will be financed up to 99% of the eligible requested funding (*costo approvato* - in the national template- eligible for Masaf). The total requested funding (100%) must be indicated in the project financial section of the project proposal (see the submission tool) and must be consistent with all eligibile costs which will be declared in the national financial forms (if the project will be selected).



Defra's priorities for funding encompass research and evidence which aims to increase productivity and sustainability, supporting the agri-food chain's transition to net zero. Projects which take a whole food chain approach from (farm to fork - production and consumption) are encouraged (subject to the specific exclusions below).

Defra's priorities for funding are bids foremost those which address topic 1, then topics 3 and 4, with our lowest priority being topic 2.

Overall, projects should take approaches which enable:

- A holistic systems approach to the food system.
- Circular systems, closing nutrient cycles, utilising side streams and minimising waste.
- Reduction of emissions, particularly GHG and/or ammonia emissions. Supporting Net Zero Commitments.
- Development towards more resilient food systems.
- Effects on yields and productivity, product quality, and profitability.

Topic 1: Enhance fertilizer efficiency and reduce fertilizer use (priority area).

This is a priority area for Defra. We are particularly interested in those areas of research on fertiliser media development where products are at a medium level of technology-readiness (typically technology readiness level 4-6). We also welcome novel research on practices and strategies to improve nutrient use efficiency. Bids should pay attention to the wider impacts and trade-offs of products and strategies (e.g. on environmental impacts such as emissions to air and water, as well as agronomic and wider). (Also see exclusions).

Topic 3: Mitigate GHGs emissions in agricultural and food systems.

We are interested in funding projects focusing on exploring reductions in greenhouse gas emissions in the post-farm gate part of the food chain (i.e. not primary production but processing, consumption, and waste reduction).

Topic 4: Sustainable energy use and production in agri-food systems.

We are particularly interested in bids which explore systems in which food production is not compromised by alternative forms of energy use or generation. This should include both pre and post farm gate energy use in production, processing, and manufacture. Explicit consideration and where possible quantification should be made of the linkages between post farm gate interventions and pre farm gate emissions (e.g. where commodity specifications must change).

Topic 2: Increase European protein self-sufficiency.

We are interested in emerging alternatives to animal feed which would be of particular benefit to the agrifood system by enhancing environmental sustainability, productivity, and resilience to climate change and shocks. Although projects specifically addressing Animal welfare are out of scope, proposals should consider and report on the potential animal health and welfare implications of interventions.

Exceptions for funding of the research topics based on your national priorities

It is required that research proposals have relevance to the context of UK agri-food system.

Some specific exclusions apply. We will <u>not</u> consider bids that focus on:

- On-farm decision support tools for nutrient management planning.
- Crop breeding.
